

Note:

A PIN is necessary in order to communicate with the ExxonMobil Benefits Service Center. If you either do not have a PIN or remember your PIN, you will need to obtain one by contacting the Benefits Service Center either by telephone or internet. Regardless of which method you choose, the system automatically will assign you a random temporary PIN, which should arrive at your home address within 7-10 business days.

- If you contact the Service Center via telephone:
 - The automated system listen will prompt you to enter your Social Security Number followed by the "pound sign" (#).
 - Next you will be asked for your PIN. At that point just wait. Do not push any keys.
 - You will be asked a second time for your PIN. Then you'll be given an opportunity to request that your existing PIN be mailed to you or you'll have a chance to request a PIN for the first time.
- If you contact the Service Center via internet:
 - Click on the link "Forgot your PIN?" on the log-in screen.
 - Next, you will have an opportunity to "Answer Challenge Questions" to help you remember your forgotten PIN, or to have the EMBSC "Mail a PIN reminder."
 - If you already do not have a PIN, the system will walk you through getting one.

Plan Overview

Group Universal Life Insurance (GUL)

As a retiree, you may keep your GUL coverage after retirement. Note that you will not be able to increase your coverage after your retirement date, or re-enroll if you cancel your coverage.

• If your retirement date is after December 1, 2015:

- You can continue GUL Insurance under the ExxonMobil Life Insurance Plan until age 95 with rates that are the same as those for active employees. The rates you pay are based on your age and the coverage amount that is in effect.
 - If you are receiving a monthly pension, then your GUL premium automatically is deducted. If you choose to suspend your annuity deduction, your premium will be automatically deducted from your Cash Accumulation Fund until it is depleted; thereafter, MetLife will send you a monthly bill for the cost of coverage.
 - ❖ If you are not receiving a monthly pension, then MetLife will bill you directly for your premium.
- At age 95, your GUL coverage is canceled, and MetLife returns any remaining money in your Cash Accumulation Fund to you.

• If your retirement date is on or before December 1, 2015:

- ❖ You can continue GUL Insurance under the ExxonMobil Life Insurance Plan until age 70 with rates that are the same as those for active employees. The rates you pay are based on your age and the coverage amount that is in effect. Your maximum coverage level is five times your annualized monthly benefit pay, rounded up to the next higher \$1,000, up to a maximum of \$10,000,000.
- If you are receiving a monthly pension, then your GUL premium is automatically deducted only until you reach age 70. If you choose to suspend your annuity deduction before you reach age 70, your premium automatically will be deducted from your Cash Accumulation Fund until it is depleted; thereafter, MetLife will send you a monthly bill for the cost of coverage.
- If you are not receiving a monthly pension, then MetLife will bill you directly for your premium.
- After you reach age 70, you no longer are eligible to participate in the GUL option under the ExxonMobil Life Insurance Plan. Your coverage, however, automatically will continue directly with MetLife unless prior to reaching age 70, you contact the ExxonMobil Benefits Service Center to cancel your coverage.
 - MetLife will determine your premiums.
 - ❖ Your benefits will be reduced to the lesser of: the current amount of your insurance (i.e., multiple of pay) or five times the value of the Cash Accumulation fund, but will not be less than the plan minimum of \$20,000.
 - At age 95, your GUL coverage is canceled, and MetLife returns any remaining money in your Cash Accumulation Fund to you.

Group Universal Life, cont'd

Here is how it works:

- The retiree's GUL coverage is moved out of the ExxonMobil Life Insurance Plan and into the MetLife Portable Pool. The effective date is the first day of the month in which a retiree turns age 70. For example, if a retiree turns age 70 on October 29, 2017, then the retiree is deemed to have turned age 70 on October 1, 2017, and therefore, is moved into the MetLife Portable Pool effective as of that date.
- The retiree's GUL coverage is reduced to the lesser of the current amount of the insurance (i.e., multiple of pay) or five times the value of the cash accumulation fund as of the day before turning age 70, but will not be less than the plan minimum of \$20,000. Using the above example, five times the value of the cash accumulation fund on September 30, 2017 will be calculated.
- A conversion notice is sent to the retiree informing that the amount of lost coverage can be converted to an individual policy, including instructions on how to do that.
- MetLife bills the retiree directly for GUL premiums. There is a nominal fee to cover administrative costs. Premiums can be paid out of a retiree's Cash Accumulation fund to the extent available.
- Upon reaching age 70, the ExxonMobil Benefits Service Center will send you a notification letter. In addition, MetLife will send you a letter containing your new coverage amount and new monthly premium, as well as other information.

Basic Life Coverage

The company pays the full cost of your Basic Life coverage. Benefits are paid if you die as a retiree eligible for coverage.

- For those whose retirement date is after December 1, 2015:
 - ➢ If you were an employee participating in the plan as of December 1, 2015, and at least 50 years of age with at least 10 years of benefit service, then your Basic Life benefit continues for five years after your retirement date with no reductions in coverage (i.e., your coverage is 150% of last annualized monthly benefit pay as a regular employee and your age at the time of death). At the end of this five-year period, your Basic Life coverage ends.
 - If you were an employee participating in the plan as of December 1, 2015, but did not have at least 50 years of age with at least 10 years of benefit service, then your Basic Life coverage ends at retirement.
- For those whose retirement date is on or before December 1, 2015:
 - If you were an employee enrolled in Basic Life and retired on or before December 1, 2015, then your Basic Life benefit will continue at 150% of last annualized monthly benefit pay until you reach age 65.
 - Beginning at age 65, your Basic Life benefit is reduced monthly on a pro-rata basis. To see the reduction schedule, Click Here.
 - The effective date of the new reduced coverage is the first day of the month in which a retiree reaches the new age bracket. For example, if a retiree turns age 65 on October 29, 2017, then the new benefit coverage of 149% of annualized monthly benefit pay is October 1, 2017.

Note: Employees with less than 15 years of benefit service, but who separated with retiree status, have 150% of annualized monthly benefit pay at age 55.
